Orlando Field / Decommissioning Programmes

Serica Energy Chinook Limited has submitted, for the consideration of the Secretary of State for the Department for Energy Security & Net Zero, draft Decommissioning Programmes for the Orlando field Pipeline and subsea infrastructures in accordance with the provisions of the Petroleum Act 1998. It is a requirement of the Act that interested parties be consulted on such decommissioning proposals.

The Orlando Field is located in the northern North Sea (Block 3/03b), approximately 127km east of Shetland, 17km from the UK/Norway Median Line and ca. 11km north east of the CNR International (UK) Limited operated Ninian Central Platform (NCP). The Orlando Field produces via NCP process systems and is then exported with Ninian Field hydrocarbons to Sullom Voe oil terminal.

The items/facilities covered by the Decommissioning Programmes are:

- All subsea installations including:
 - Production Xmas Tree including Wellhead Protection Structure
 - Production and umbilical riser base structures

- The following submarine pipelines and associated apparatus:
 - PL4383 pipeline
 - PLU4384 umbilical
 - Associated spools (including Wellhead Valve Spool structure), risers and subsea isolation valve structure
 - Surface laid/exposed pipeline/umbilical protective and stabilisation materials (concrete mattresses and grout bags)
